In Board of Aldermen, *July 24. 1888.*

Ordered,

That permission be granted to the Maverick Oil Company to lay and maintain an iron pipe for pumping oil from the works of said company at corner of Sixth and Potter streets to its railroad track on Rogers Street, as follows, viz: beginning at the corrugated iron building of said company on the west side of Sixth Street; thence extending under the sidewalk on the west side of Sixth Street, to Potter Street, so-called, crossing Potter Street at a point west of the hydrant near the corner of Potter and Sixth Streets; thence extending under the gutter on the west side of Sixth Street crossing Piney Street, so-called, and thence extending to the railroad track on Rogers Street, and turning at a right angle to meet said railroad track.

The right to lay and maintain an iron pipe, as aforesaid, is granted under the following conditions, viz: said company shall file a plan of said pipe in the office of the City Engineer before commencing to lay the same, and the entire matter shall be under

the direction of the City Engineer and Superintendent of Streets, and subject to their approval. Said pipe shall be removed whenever the Board of Aldermen shall so require. Said company shall also file with the city clerk, a satisfactory bond in the sum of Three Thousand Dollars, to hold the city harmless from all claims for damages, arising from the laying and maintenance of said pipe.
