To the Mayor & Aldermen
of the City of Cambridge -

The undersigned on behalf
the Commonwealth respectfully
acknowledges notice of a hearing
appointed for the eighteenth day of
November and of the intention of your
Honorable board to lay out at
that time Chaucery Street as a public
highway in part over the land of the
Commonwealth. The land proposed
to be taken is, as I am informed,
already appropriated to one public
use by the Commonwealth. The same

being a portion of the Arsenal grounds

The Commonwealth claiming that the
city of Cambridge has not the power
without special legislative permission
to take for a highway its land,
under any circumstances, and
particularly not when already
appropriated to another public use.

I am instructed to protest against
any such location and to insist
that if made it will be void.

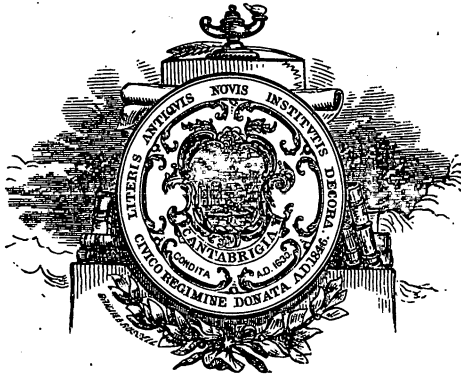
