The Committee on Roads and Bridges
would respectfully

Report

Recommending that
the paving of main street be continued during
the coming year as follows: - From the crossing
opposite Keeney's bakery westerly, & and
including Central Square, and on the west-
erly side of said street from Quincy Square
to Putnam Avenue. For paving the distance
first named about 335000 granite blocks will
be required, and about 35000, between the
other two points on the westerly side of the
street. In accordance with the foregoing
recommendation your committee submits the
accompanying order authorizing it to adver-
tise for proposals and contract for about
340000, not Granite Paving blocks for the
purpose mentioned, said blocks to be delivered

as required during the month of June, July

and August 1888.
