In Board of Aldermen, Dec. 8. 1868.

Ordered: Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that Vine Street, so called, from Third Street to Fourth Street, be laid out as a public way,

Ordered, That said Vine Street be and hereby is laid out and established as a public way, by the name of Vine Street; agreeably to a Plan thereof drawn by the City Engineer, bearing date of Nov. 3. 1868, and now on file in the office of the City Clerk, to wit: from Third Street to Fourth Street; the same to be fifty feet in width, as shown by the red lines delineation on said Plan.

Ordered, That no damages be awarded to the persons over whose land said Vine Street is laid out as aforesaid.
