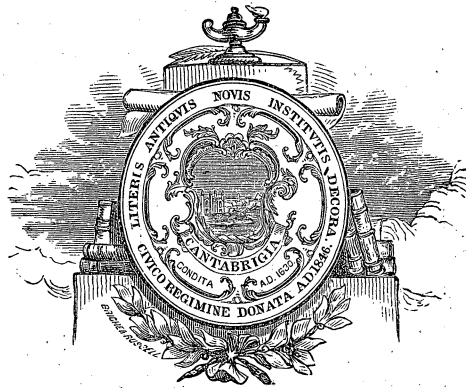


CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.



In Board of Mayor and Aldermen, Sept: 20. 1864-

WHEREAS, in the opinion of the Board, the safety and convenience of the inhabitants require that *Dana Street, so called, between Broadway and Cambridge* Street should be *laid out as a public highway,*

it is therefore hereby Ordered, that due notice be given to *the owners of land on said Dana Street and all others interested,*

that this Board intends to *lay out* the Street before mentioned, by taking a portion of *their* land and laying out the same as a public street — and that *wednesday, the 12th* day of *October next,* at *8* o'clock, *P. M.,* is assigned as the time for hearing any objections which may be made thereto.
