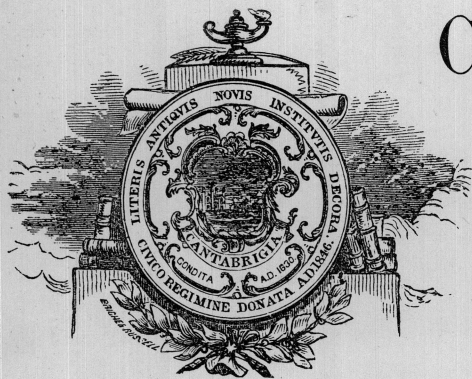

WHEREAS: It is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that

Hoost Street
From Forest to Roseland Street

should be laid out as a public Street. Ordered that a strip of land
Forty feet in width between

said Forest Street
and Roseland Street,

included between the *red* lines as shown on a plan drawn by *J G Chase*
City Engineer

on file in the Office of the City Engineer
and now ~~before this Board~~, be taken for public use and laid out as a public Street.

Ordered that *no* damages be allowed for the land so taken as aforesaid.

And that thirty days be allowed to the
abutters on said Street to remove the
fences that may encroach thereon.
