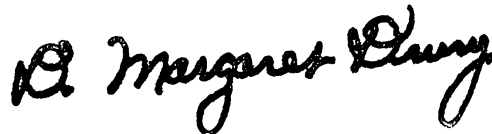

WHEREAS: Harvard University may be said to have been a home to printing since 1643 when Henry Dunster, first president of Harvard College, inherited his wife's printing press, plates, and paper, it was not until January 13, 1913, that the Harvard Corporation established the entity known as Harvard University Press (HUP); and

WHEREAS: The Harvard University Press Display Room was established in Harvard Square in 1948, and is Harvard University Press's own bookstore, located in the heart of Harvard Square in the Holyoke Center Arcade; and

WHEREAS: The Display Room has an enormous selection of new and old Harvard University Press Books, including the world-famous Loeb Classical Library the only series which (through original text and English translation) provides access to all that is important in ancient Greek and Latin literature; and

WHEREAS: William P. Sisler, the Director of Harvard University Press, stated that HUP is "interested in books that cross borders and break down barriers;" and

WHEREAS: Published luminaries include, T. S. Eliot, E.E. Cummings, Leonard Bernstein, Italo Calvino, John Cage and Nadine Gordimer; and

WHEREAS: The Loeb Library, now undergoing a vigorous program of revision and updating, totals nearly 500 volumes of Greek and Latin texts, with facing English translations, and is today published worldwide by the Press, enjoying annual sales of well over 100,000 volumes; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That upon the occasion of Harvard Square's First Bookish Ball, a community-wide celebration of the bookstores of Harvard Square and the 90th anniversary celebration of Harvard University Press and the 60th anniversary of the Harvard University Display Room, the City of Cambridge wishes to and does hereby formally and sincerely recognize, gratefully acknowledge and express its deepest appreciation to William P. Sisler, Director of Harvard University Press and Jeffrey S. Flemming, Manager of the Harvard University Press Room Display and their staff for their dedicated service to the citizens of Harvard Square, Cambridge, and the world beyond; and be it further
