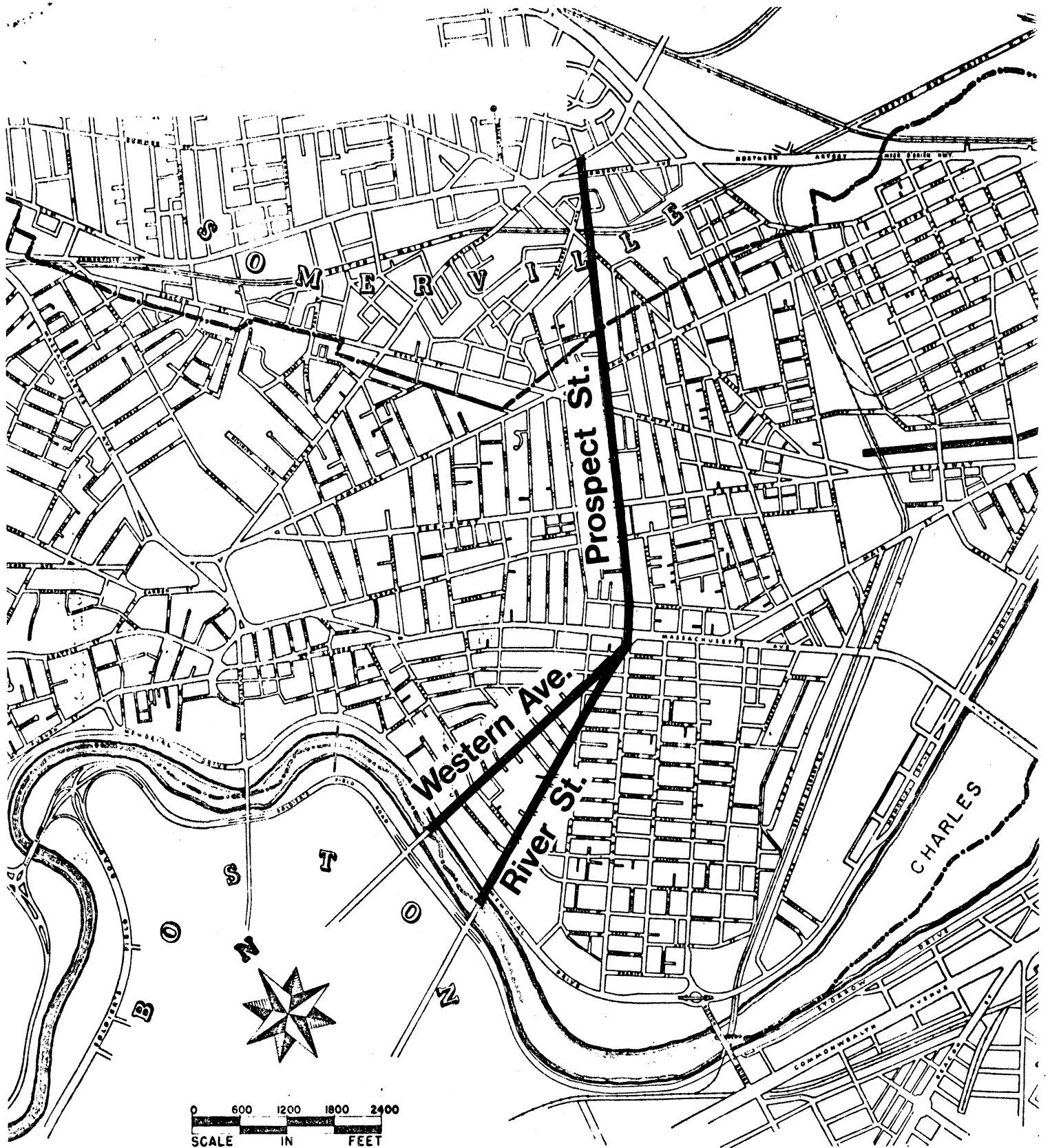
P R E S S R E L E A S E

On July 18, 1974, the Cities of Somerville and Cambridge will begin enforcing the ban on Heavy "THROUGH" commercial vehicles carrying non-dangerous cargo weekdays between the hours of 7:00 PM to 7:00 AM and 24 hours on Saturdays and Sundays over River Street, Western Avenue and Prospect Street in Cambridge and over Prospect Street in Somerville. Appropriate signs will be posted at all major intersections along these streets and on all approaches to the corridor, warning drivers of the ban.

We are advising all trucking companies who do not conduct business in these communities to use other highways and avoid these streets, as we will be enforcing this regulation daily. This has been approved by both Cities and by the State Department of Public Works. The cooperation of all commercial vehicle operators is essential. A plan showing the streets where this ban is in effect, is shown above.
