VICE MAYOR REEVES:

- WHEREAS: It is reasonable for all Cambridge residents to expect prompt snow and ice removal from roads and sidewalks, and particularly from sidewalks abutting city-owned properties; and
- WHEREAS: The lack of adequate snow and ice removal makes passage of our streets and sidewalks difficult and even impossible for many of our frail and elderly residents as well as for those with physical handicaps; and
- WHEREAS: Numerous complaints have been received regarding the lack of adequate removal of snow and ice, particularly in the Cambridgeport-Riverside area; and
- WHEREAS: These complaints include the failure to adequately clear the sidewalk abutting the Martin Luther King, Jr. School on Putnam Avenue by Monday, January 14, 1991, in order to provide safe passage for returning school children and neighboring residents; and the failure to remove a huge mound of snow and ice which prevented passage on the sidewalk at the intersection of River and Pleasant Streets, a stretch of sidewalk also abutting city-owned property; and
- WHEREAS: Calls have also been received regarding inadequate snow removal on Sacramento Place, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council request the City Manager to consult with the Acting Commissioner of Public Works and report back within one week with a solution for the problem of inadequate snow and ice removal from city-owned property.
