Remove Sidewalk Obstruction at Premises 1100 Mass. Avenue

The sidewalk obstruction at 1100 Mass. Avenue was a fence protecting an open excavation erected in June 1973, by Norman K. White Construction Company, for a building to be constructed by Max Wasserman, the owner, but was unsuccessful in developing this parcel and has since sold the parcel to Hugh Stubbins & Associates. I have contacted Mr. Parker of this company and he has informed me that they are completing plans to develop this parcel this fall.

The fence was not erected by him, but they have agreed to assume responsibility for it and have requested that we grant them sufficient time to have a contractor on site and begin development. They will take all necessary precautions to protect the pedestrian while this work is being done.

I feel that in view of the previous problems with the development of this site, the new developer is making a sincere attempt to get this project going, and the City should assist them in resolving this problem of sidewalk obstruction. I will keep in contact with Mr. Parker and get this resolved.

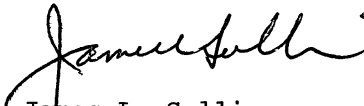
