Lydia S. Kring asking for an abatement
of her tax for the sidewalk in Prospect Street
would respectfully

Report

That your
Committee find the tax of the petitioner to be
correctly assessed. That they find no
reasons why the whole or a part of the tax
of the petitioner should be abated that would
not apply with equal force to a large number
of abutters whose estates are greatly benefited
by these improvements. That inasmuch as
the sidewalk tax is not assessed for the purpose
of a revenue but as a reimbursement, in part, to
the City for the direct benefit it has conferred upon

the abutments your committee
