In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-eight.

An Ordinance,

in addition to an Ordinance in relation to the duties of the City Messenger.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:

Sec. 1. The City Messenger shall attend to letting the Halls connected with the City Hall, and shall attend to the opening and closing of same, under such regulations as the Mayor and Aldermen may establish; and shall collect and pay into the City Treasury all monies due for rent of the Halls.

Sec. 2. The City Messenger shall receive an annual salary of Five Hundred Dollars, in equal quarterly payments, commencing on the first day of April last past.

which shall be in full for all services rendered by him
in that capacity.

Sect. 3. So much of an Ordinance in relation to
Salaries of City Officers, in the Municipal Register, page
one hundred and twenty-seven, as relates to the City
Clerk is hereby repealed.
