Francis Skiddy von Stade Jr.

Harvard administrator

Francis Skiddy von Stade Jr. died Sept. 29 at the Cheshire Medical Center in Keene, NH. He was 79.

He was born in Westbury, NY, and lived in Cambridge for many years. He attended St. Paul's School in Concord and studied history and literature at Harvard University, graduating in 1938. At Harvard, he played on two intercollegiate championship polo teams. In 1937, he traveled to Argentina as a member of the US team competing in the polo world cup. As an undergraduate at Harvard, he devoted much of his time to helping students get through their first year. After graduating from Harvard, he taught for a year at St. Paul's School, then did a year's graduate work at the University of North Carolina.

He became an assistant dean at Harvard in 1940. In 1942, he again left Harvard, this time to serve as an officer in Naval intelligence. After World War II, in 1946, he again returned to Harvard and six years later was named dean of freshman. He also served as master of Mather House. A chronic back injury forced him to take early retirement from his post in 1976.

After his retirement, he and his wife moved to a home they had built in Dublin, NH, where he quickly became involved in the community. He served on the Dublin Planning Board and on the board of Dublin School. He continued to be a member of the Tavern Club of Boston and was an avid golfer.

He was the husband of Susan

(Russell) and father of Christopher R. of Shelby, NC, William F. of Nelson, NH, and Susan of Voorhees, NJ. He was the brother of Frederick H. of Glen Head, NY, Philip R. of Locust Valley, NY, John T. Skiddy of Peapack, NJ, Dolly Bostwick of Aiken, SC, Kathyne Krumpe of Cincinnati and Nannie Ward of Beaufort, SC.

The funeral was held Oct. 3 at Dublin Community Church followed by private burial. A memorial service in Cambridge is planned.
