RESOLVED: This City Council go on record urging the President and fellows of Harvard College to re-examine this access question and in true neighborhood spirit allow access and useage to the community at large and the Banks Street and Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School communities in particular; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Harvard President Neil Rudenstein on behalf of the entire City Council.
