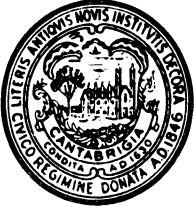

To the Honorable, the City Council:

In response to Awaiting Report No. 13 regarding the re-installation of the inbound bus stop in the vicinity of Edward T. Sullivan Road and Belmont Street, I have been notified by the MBTA that the stop was removed at the request of abutters who were suffering from harassment and vandalism. Since the stop is located in Watertown, the MBTA recently requested that the Watertown Council grant permission to install a stop nearby at 102 Belmont Street. This permission was denied due to safety hazards at that location.
