85; helped build, guide Framingham

Anthony M. Colonna, a former state legislator and civic leader so integral to his hometown that he was known as "Mr. Framingham," died Monday in St. Patrick's Manor in Framingham. He was 85.

He retired as Framingham District Court clerk-magistrate in April after two separate incidents in which he was accused of choking a co-worker and brandishing a knife at members of his family.

The charges, which were later dropped, were a blemish on an otherwise productive life of public service.

Mr. Colonna, who began serving on municipal boards in Framingham in 1950, was elected to the Massachusetts House in 1954. After three House terms, he sought the Democratic nomination for lieutenant governor in 1962 and lost. Governor Endicott Peabody appointed Mr. Colonna as clerk of courts in 1963 and Mr. Colonna returned his ambitions to Framingham politics.

As he consolidated his authority at the Framingham District Court, Mr. Colonna also served as the town's powerful public works commissioner, an elected post that gave him control of public funding of construction in town.

An advocate of commercial development, Mr. Colonna was widely credited with making sure that Framingham got two exits off the turnpike, a decision that's considered one of the keys to the town's progress as a business center for the western suburbs. He also executed plans for miles of sewer and water lines that opened vast areas for construction.

Mr. Colonna leaves his wife, Dorothy Ann; a son, James, of Falmouth; a daughter, Judith Dallamora of Framingham; 14 grandchildren, and four great-grandchildren.

A funeral Mass will be said at 10 a.m. Friday at St. Bridget's church. Burial will be in Edgell Grove Cemetery in Framingham.

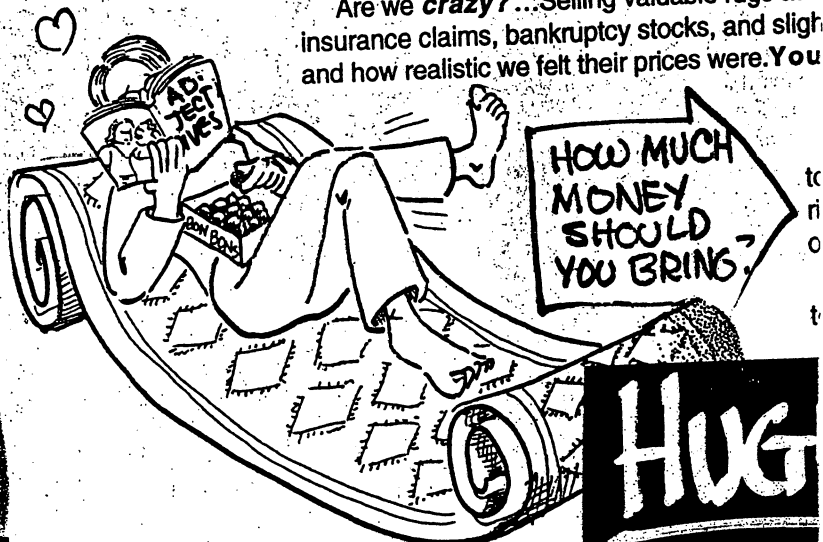
