- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that shortly before midnight on Monday, September 1, 1980 a five alarm fire erupted on Brookline Street, and
- WHEREAS: The members of the Cambridge Fire Department, under the direction of Fire Chief Daniel J. Reagan, and the assistance of firefighters from Boston, Brookline and Somerville worked feverishly for over three hours in order to bring the blaze under control, and
- WHEREAS: Damage to the property on Brookline Street which housed the Latin-O Restaurant, Hilco Electric Supply Company and a storage facility for Macy's Furniture was extensive, no loss of life occurred and the fire was under control before it could reach a fully occupied five story apartment building, and
- WHEREAS: Several firefighters were overcome from smoke inhalation and injuries sustained at this fire, now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation and gratitude to Fire Chief Daniel J. Reagan and his entire department for their dedication and true professionalism shown during the early morning hours of September 2, 1980, and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Chief Reagan to be read to all firefighters on behalf of the entire City Council.
