In Board of Aldermen,

Ordered,

That permission be and hereby is given to the owners of St. Mary's Catholic Church property, to lay a pipe for the transmission of steam for heating purposes, under Norfolk Street, from the Catholic Church building, on the corner of Norfolk and Howard Streets, to Aquinas Hall, so-called on said Norfolk Street, and also to lay a return pipe between the church and hall aforesaid.

Provided, that this permission is given upon the following conditions, namely:— a plan of said pipes shall be filed in the office of the City Engineer, and the entire matter of laying the same shall be under the ^{of said} ~~of said~~ ^{close the gaps of streets and the City Engineer} direction and subject to their approval. Said pipes shall be taken up and removed at the expense of said owners thereof, whenever in the judgment of the Board of Aldermen the public interests shall require such removal.

The bond provided for in the order of this board adopted Sept. 5, shall also include a stipulation that the city shall be saved harmless from any claims for damages, arising from the laying of the pipes, permitted by this order.
