- WHEREAS:** Historically Third Street has been one of the most heavily travelled streets in Cambridge; and
- WHEREAS:** With the recent prohibition of truck traffic through most streets in East Cambridge and the closing of the Prospect St. bridge, the traffic on Third Street has increased even further; and
- WHEREAS:** This tremendous volume of traffic poses a serious danger to those residents, especially children wishing to cross Third Street; now therefore be it
- ORDERED:** That the City Manager be and hereby is requested to install a pedestrian crossing light at the intersection of Third and Hurley Streets for the protection of residents and children.
