MAYOR REEVES

WHEREAS: Boston, Cambridge and surrounding communities are home to a great diversity of people who bring to the Commonwealth wonderful color and vitality; and

WHEREAS: The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority and WGBH are launching the first "T Party", in an effort to promote the musical and cultural diversity of our communities. The "T Party" will be held on Sunday, October 4, 1992 between 11:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. and

WHEREAS: This "T Party", not to be confused with the one involving a ship some time ago, will be a subterranean mega fiesta, alive with music, food and performers from the five continents; and

WHEREAS: The MBTA and WGBH will transform several stations to markets, bazaars and concert places. There will be a huge Musicfest to entertain riders; and

WHEREAS: Kendall Station, Central Station, Harvard Station and Alewife Station are participating sites; and

WHEREAS: For a small flat fee, riders will be able to enjoy all of the festivities and celebrations, by shuffling from station to station, giving the effect of Disneyland for New Englanders; and

WHEREAS: WGBH and the MBTA have the two-fold goal of promoting alternative forms of transportation (as the Central Artery Project gets underway) and also to celebrating cultural diversity; and

WHEREAS: The "T Party" is an innovative, positive event for the surrounding communities, and WGBH and the MBTA ought to be commended, now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That the Cambridge City Council applauds and extends its appreciation to WGBH and the MBTA for organizing the first "T Party"; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the residents of this City take part in what promises to be an entertaining and worthwhile event.
