# CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

IN THE YEAR ONE THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND SEVENTY-THREE.

AN ORDINANCE IN RELATION TO SEWERS.

*Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cambridge, as follows:*

Chapter Twenty-three of the Revised Ordinances is hereby amended, as follows:

1st

By striking out all of Sec. 1, and inserting in place thereof the following:

The City Council shall determine upon the necessity of all main drains and common sewers, in the same manner that public streets are laid out; and such drains and sewers so laid out through streets, shall be laid as nearly as possible in the centre of the streets or highways in which they are constructed. They shall be built of such material, size, depth and grade, as shall be ordered, under the supervision of the City Engineer.

2<sup>d</sup>

By striking out the last line of Sec. 3, being the words — "and for one year thereafter."

3<sup>d</sup>

By striking out of Sec. 7 all between the word "drains," in the third line, and the word "shall," in the ninth line, and inserting in place thereof the following:

Shall assess not exceeding fifty cents per running foot on each side of all sewers and drains so constructed, upon all persons and corporations owning land abutting on streets where such sewers or drains are laid, or owning land through which the same are laid; provided, however, that corner lots, having been assessed for a sewer on one street shall be exempt from an assessment for a sewer on the other, to the extent of seventy-five feet from the corner.
