In the year one thousand eight-hundred and sixty.

An Ordinance

for the prevention and removal of certain nuisances
and obstructions.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of Cam-
bridge, as follows:—

Sec. 1. The Mayor and Aldermen are authorized to pro-
hibit the keeping of swine and goats in any part or
parts of the city where they shall deem that the keeping
of such animals would be detrimental to the health or
comfort of the citizens in the neighborhood thereof residing,
or passing, and shall have power to remove or cause
to be removed any swine or goats from any place
where the keeping of such animals is prohibited.

Sec. 2. Any and every person who shall keep any
swine or goats in any place in the city in which the
keeping of such animals is prohibited, or from which

he is required to remove the same ~~from~~ ^{six} hours after having received notice in writing from the City Clerk, by order of the Mayor and Aldermen, to remove the same, or that such animals are prohibited from being kept in such place, shall forfeit and pay the sum of three dollars for each and every swine ~~and~~ or goat so kept, for each and every day during which he shall so keep the same or any of them.

Sec. 3. No owner, or person having the care of any sheep, swine, horses, mules, oxen, cows or other grazing animals, shall permit or suffer the same to stop to feed on any street, lane, alley, common, square, or other public place within the city.

Sec. 4. No owner, or other person having the care or ordering of any chair, carryall, carriage, truck, cart, wagon, sleigh, sled, or any other vehicle whatever, (new or old, finished or unfinished, not having a horse or horses, or other animal or animals, harnessed thereto, or of any hand-car, wheel-barrow, sleigh, hand-sled or any other vehicle whatever, intended to be drawn, propelled or wheeled by hand, new or old, finished or unfinished, - shall suffer the same to remain standing in any street, ~~square~~ ^{lane, alley, common, square or other public place} ~~or~~ ^{or upon any sidewalk within} the city.

Sect. 5. Any persons who shall offend against any of the provisions of the two preceding sections shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding twenty dollars.
