- WHEREAS: A noted jurist, Cambridge resident and humanitarian, the Honorable Lawrence F. Feloney, retired as a Justice of the District Court Department of the Trial Court of the Cambridge Division effective September 11, 1991, completing twenty eight years on the bench; and
- WHEREAS: Judge Feloney, is a graduate of Harvard College, class of 1943, receiving a bachelor of arts degree and obtained his bachelor of law degree in 1948 from Boston University Law School, and in 1971 was honored by the New England School of Law by being awarded an honorary Doctor of Jurisprudence degree; and
- WHEREAS: Throughout his life, Judge Feloney always was available to provide help and assistance to his city and to those in need, having served as chairman of the Board of Library Trustees, chairman of the Cambridge Recreation Commission, president of the Cambridge Mental Health Association and chairman of the Cambridge-Somerville Area Board for Mental Health and Retardation Services, and has been a founder and first president of Cambridge and Somerville Programs for Alcoholism Rehabilitation, just to mention a few of his many charitable works; and
- WHEREAS: Prior to his judicial work, Larry served as a member of the Great and General Court as a Representative from Cambridge from 1953 to 1962 and became the Legislative secretary to Governor Endicott Peabody in 1963, prior to being appointed to the bench serving in East Cambridge throughout his tenure, rising to serve as Presiding Justice and Regional Administrative Judge of the District Court Department; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest appreciation to Judge Lawrence F. Feloney on the occasion of this retirement from the court and to further extend to him every good wish for much continued good health and happiness during his retirement, something he truly has earned; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Judge Feloney on behalf of the entire City Council.

On September 11, 1991, Lawrence F. Feloney, a Justice of the Cambridge District Court, retired at the mandatory age of 70.

On November 16, 1991, a retirement testimonial will be held at the Cambridge Center Marriott, which I am privileged to chair, to honor this outstanding jurist who has faithfully served the citizens of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts for the past 38 years.

Judge Feloney was elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives in 1953 and served with distinction until 1962. He was appointed Legislative Secretary to Governor Endicott Peabody in 1963 and served in that capacity until his appointment as a Judge on November 23, 1963.
