

City of Cambridge.

In the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and Seventy Seven,

An Ordinance establishing the salary of
the City Clerk.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City
of Cambridge, as follows,

Sect. 1. From and after the first Monday of
January, in the year One Thousand Eight Hundred
and seventy eight, the salary of the City Clerk,
in full for all services required of him by the
charter and ordinances of the city, and the
laws of the Commonwealth, shall be Three
Thousand Dollars each year.

Sect. 2. The office of the City Clerk shall
be kept open for public business each day
except Sundays and holidays, between
the hours of eight in the morning and four
in the afternoon.

Sect. 3. All ordinances and parts of ordinances
inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.
