the said City of Cambridge or ~~its~~ ~~executors, administrators, or assigns~~
we hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators.

The condition of the obligation is such that if the said Frederick B. Furbish
shall well and truly save the City of Cambridge, harmless
from, and indemnified against any and all claims,
liabilities, loss, cost and damage by reason of the construc-
tion of certain seats in and over the sidewalk near Holden
Chapel, for the exercises on Class Day, Friday, June 25th,
current - under the permission given by the Mayor and
Aldermen of said city to construct such seats,

then this obligation shall be void, otherwise it shall be and remain in full force and virtue.
