- WHEREAS: Small businesses and residents of surrounding neighborhoods have worked together for many years to keep Inman Square a thriving neighborhood business center; and
- WHEREAS: The growth of nighttime entertainment and proliferation of liquor licenses in Inman Square has now begun to threaten these long-term efforts; and
- WHEREAS: The License Commission has recently decided to "cap" the number of liquor licenses in every other area facing such a threat, including Central, Harvard and Porter Squares; therefore, be it
- ORDERED: That the City Manager request the License Commission to consider whether to adopt a liquor license cap in Inman Square, and to solicit public comment from area residents and business on whether a cap is advisable, and if so what the boundaries of the capped area should be.
