Dear Kathy:

I am writing to you at the request of the MCNA, which met last night. After thorough review of the Quincy Sq. Gulf Site Design Committee's drawings, the Association voted unanimously to support the following features of any hotel or other building Harvard constructs on the Quincy Sq. Gulf Station site:

- Setback on the Harvard Street side consistent with present character of that street;
- Mass of building should be toward the church, away from Quincy St., in order to create a public plaza similar to Forbes Plaza in front of Holyoke Center; and
- All vehicular access to the site from Mass. Ave. -- no entrance or exit on Harvard Street side.

The MCNA intends to advocate these design objectives vigorously through the Harvard Square Design Advisory Committee, our representative on that Committee, Hugh Russell, and other appropriate channels.

I urge you to communicate our concerns to everyone at Harvard who is involved in physical planning and design and would be glad to organize a presentation of our Design Committee's drawings and findings if that would be helpful.
