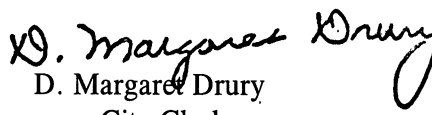

Anthony C. Platt, 55

Cambridge architect

A memorial service will be held today for Anthony C. Platt of Cambridge, an architect whose projects included the renovation of Boston's Old City Hall, the Chart House restaurant on Long Wharf in Boston, and H.H. Richardson's Union Station in New London, Conn.

Mr. Platt, who also was the author of the master plan for the rehabilitation of Charlestown Navy Yard, died Thursday in Beth Israel Deaconess Medical Center in Boston after apparently suffering a heart attack while on his way to the symphony. He was 55.

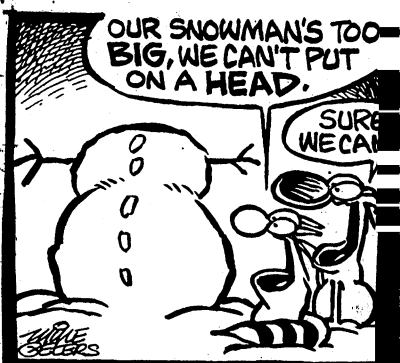
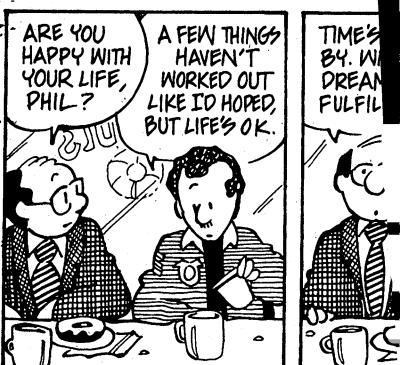
Born in Washington, D.C., he graduated from Pennsylvania State University and the Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

The founder of the Platt Anderson Freeman Associated Architects in Cambridge, he also designed the Gifford School in Weston and Eagle House Senior Center in Lunenburg.

He was a director and treasurer of the Boston Society of Architects and founder and chairman of Build Boston, the society's annual convention for design professionals. He was chairman of the Mid-Cambridge Neighborhood Conservation District Commission and served on the Cambridge Historic Commission.

He leaves his wife, Nancy Goodwin; two sons, Randy of Somerville and Kevin of Los Angeles; a brother, Andy, and his mother, Helen, both of Woodville, Va.

The memorial service will be held at 2 p.m. in Story Chapel at Mount Auburn Cemetery in Cambridge.
