- WHEREAS: This City, along with the entire Commonwealth was shocked and saddened by the recent and tragic deaths of the family of Philip Pierce, a member of the Cambridge Rent Control Board; and
- WHEREAS: Mr. Pierce lost his brother Allen, father, Edwin, sister-in-law, Laurie McLean Pierce and her one year old son Jeffrey, while they were retruning home from a Christmas Eve visit; and
- WHEREAS: This senseless accident occurred because of the action of a drunken driver, who lost control of his vehicle, driving head on into the Pierce family car; and
- WHEREAS: This kind of tragedy is never easily accepted, but in this case even more difficult because of the circumstances of the accident and the personal knowledge of Mr. Philip Pierce, a person who has devoted much of his time in the unsalaried position as a member of the Rent Control Board; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deep sympathy to Philip Pierce at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mr. Pierce on behalf of the entire City Council.
