- WHEREAS: On the morning of Tuesday, September 18th, Detective John Conroy was going over the previous night's arrest records when the address given by a robbery suspect rang a bell of recognition in his head; and
- WHEREAS: After reviewing the file of a man he arrested some six months earlier, consulting with Sergeant Richard Ooxie, Patrolmen Gerald Baptist and Walter Brutley, and checking data and fingerprints with the Boston Police, it was found that the robbery suspect was wanted under another name for murder; and
- WHEREAS: The suspect was about to be released on bail for the robbery, he was immediately arrested and held for the murder charge; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council commend Detective John Conroy on his memory and keen powers of observation in the performance of his duty, and also note the contributions made to the case by Sergeant Richard Ooxie and Patrolmen Gerald Baptist and Walter Brutley; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to each of the officers mentioned above and to further forward a copy to Chief Anthony Paolillo for inclusion in their respective personnel files.
