- WHEREAS: In the environmentally conscious 1990s, the importance of trees and their critical role in our earth is more significant than ever; and
- WHEREAS: The idea of celebrating our trees, and our environment, extends back to 1872 when J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and
- WHEREAS: Since 1872, Arbor Day is celebrated all over the United States and world with the realization that trees reduce soil erosion, cut heating and cooling costs, and provide shelter to animals and pleasure to humans; and
- WHEREAS: Cambridge, being one of the most densely populated urban areas in the United States, has cherished its limited green spaces, its tree-lined streets, and ivy-covered universities; and
- WHEREAS: It is with great pride we find ourselves honored as a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation; therefore, be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council support the Arbor Day celebrations at Kingsley Park, Fresh Pond, on April 28, 1990 where over fifty thousand dollars of free tree pruning and planting will take place, and where individuals and families will celebrate Arbor Day; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk is hereby requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to honor Arbor Day and City Arborist Jack Kelly whose hard work is largely responsible for our designation of a Tree City USA.
