- WHEREAS: This City Council was deeply saddened upon learning of the death of Thomas F. Gibson, former life long Cantabrigian and former long term Chairman and member of the Board of Assessors; and
- WHEREAS: Tom began his public service career in 1930 when he was first elected as a member of the City Council and served in that legislative body in addition to the 1930 to 1931 term, three consecutive terms, beginning in 1934 up to and including 1939, serving as Council President in 1936 and 1937; and
- WHEREAS: Tom was also elected to the Massachusetts House of Representatives and later served his country during World War II as a member of the United States Navy, attaining the rank of Lieutenant Commander, prior to his honorable discharge; and
- WHEREAS: Tom returned to the service of the City of Cambridge in September of 1945, where his training as both an attorney and legislator provided the Board of Assessors with a tremendous amount of knowledge for some thirty-one years; and
- WHEREAS: The City of Cambridge has lost, through death, a valued individual and public servant, one who truly loved Cambridge and its inhabitants; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending its deepest sympathy to Mrs. Margaret "Peg" Gibson and the Gibson family at this time of such personal loss; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Mrs. Gibson on behalf of the entire City Council.
