And said Company hereby ratifies and confirms all and whatsoever said Attorney(s)-in-fact may lawfully do in the premises by virtue of these presents.

This appointment is made under and by authority of the following Resolution passed by the Board of Directors of said Company at a meeting held at the principal office of said Company, a quorum being present and voting, on the fourteenth day of April, 1982, which resolution is still in effect:

"RESOLVED, That the President or any Vice President, in conjunction with any Assistant Vice President, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to appoint Attorneys-in-fact of the Company, in its name and as its acts, to execute and acknowledge for and on its behalf as Surety any and all bonds, recognizances, contracts of indemnity, waivers of citation and all other writings obligatory in the nature thereof, with power to attach thereto the seal of the Company. 


Dated the 11th day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-six.

THE CONDITION OF THIS OBLIGATION IS SUCH, That the aforesaid

Daniel J. Saccoccio

having been appointed by the City Manager of the City of Cambridge one of the Constables within the said City, for the term ending ~~one~~^{three} year from the first Monday in January, 19 86, and until another be appointed in his place, now if said Daniel J. Saccoccio shall faithfully exercise all the powers and perform all the duties entrusted to and imposed upon him by the laws of the Commonwealth and the ordinances of the City of Cambridge; shall carefully intend the preservation of the peace, the discovery and prevention of all attempts against the same; shall duly execute all warrants which shall be sent unto him from lawful authority, and faithfully attend to all such directions in the laws and orders of Court, as are or shall be committed to his care; shall comply with the orders and directions of the City Manager and Council, which shall be passed from time to time for the regulation of the Constables; shall faithfully and with what speed he can, collect and levy all such fines, distresses, rates, assessments, and sums of money for which he shall have sufficient warrants according to law, rendering an account thereof, and paying the same according to the direction in his warrant; and also, if he shall faithfully perform all the duties of a Constable in the service of all civil processes which may be committed to him, then this obligation shall be void, otherwise it shall remain in full force and effect.
