That the City Manager is hereby requested to meet with the Chairperson of the Cambridge Rent Control Board to convey the displeasure of Cambridge City Council with the action of the Board and for the City Manager to report back to the City Council on the Cambridge Rent Control Board's work process flow; and be it further

ORDERED:

That the City Manager is hereby requested to ask the Cambridge Rent Control Board to rescind the foregoing vote dated June 11, 1986.
