

This June, the United Nations will hold a Special Session on Disarmament. On Saturday, June 12th, there will be a massive demonstration in New York City to support the Special Session (UN SSD-II).

Why should we support the UN SSD-II?

Because:

Current planning for "limited" nuclear war makes the occurrence of a full scale nuclear war more likely than at any time since the Cuban missile crisis in 1962.

Currently on any single day, over \$1 billion is spent around the world on feeding the arms race, while simultaneously between 50,000 - 80,000 people die daily from malnutrition and sheer physical deprivation.

This June will be only the second time in the history of the United Nations that all of its members (over 130 countries) will be meeting in a special session to discuss world-wide disarmament...A third chance may not occur!

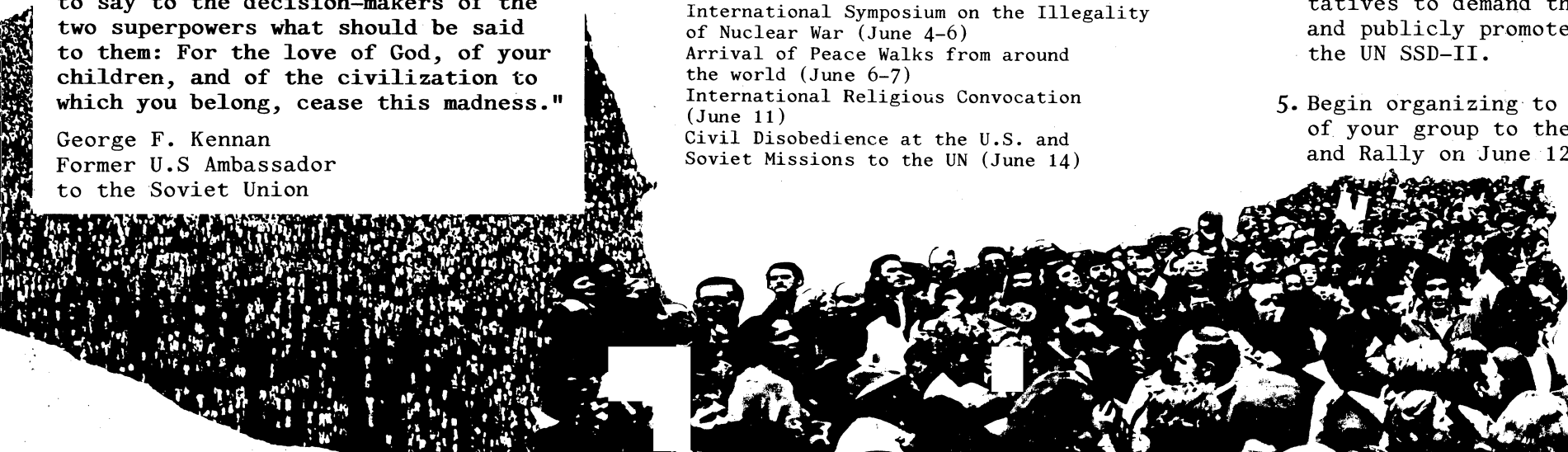
Civil Disobedience at the U.S. and Soviet Missions to the UN (June 14)

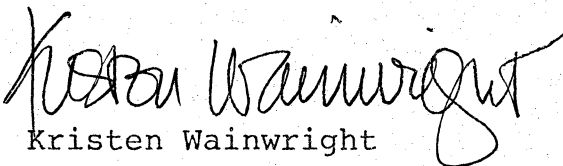
