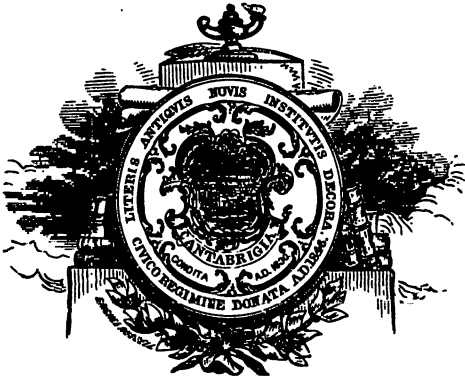




# City of Cambridge.
