WHEREAS: In her physical absence, Regina B. Key has left a significant void in the educational system of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School, but the seeds of promise she has sown will impact the lives of generations yet unborn; and

WHEREAS: In appreciation and acknowledgement for fifty four years of distinguished service and selfless contributions rendered by Regina B. Key, a library will be dedicated in her honor at the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School on May 12, 1993; now therefore be it

RESOLVED: That this Cambridge City Council does hereby applaud the extraordinary life of Regina B. Key who exemplified the spirit of sharing and daily devotion to the academic development and growth of the youth of our day; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to prepare a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution for presentation to the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Elementary School Community on behalf of the entire City Council.
