

CITY OF CAMBRIDGE.

In Board of Aldermen, June 11 1889

Ordered,

Whereas, Notice has been given by the Superintendent of Streets, agreeably to the provisions of the city ordinances, that obstructions exist upon certain streets, said obstructions being caused by the erection and maintenance of booths for the sale of fruits and other merchandise,

it is therefore

Ordered, That notice be served upon all parties maintaining booths upon the streets of the city, to remove the same within seven days from the date hereof, in default of which removal the Superintendent of Streets is hereby directed to cause the removal of all such booths.

Also, that all persons occupying or obstructing the public streets or sidewalks for the purpose of storing vehicles of any description thereon, - such vehicles not being intended for immediate use, - be notified to discontinue such occupation and obstruction forthwith.

The Committee on Police, respectfully
Reports,

That notice having been given by the Superintendent of Streets, agreeably to the provisions of Section 8, of Chapter 56, of the Revised Ordinances, that obstructions are maintained upon certain streets and sidewalks, said obstructions consisting of booths for the sale of fruit and other merchandise; - also that certain parties are occupying and obstructing the streets and sidewalks by the storage of vehicles thereon, - your committee therefore recommends the adoption of the accompanying order providing that notice be issued to parties maintaining booths as aforesaid, to remove the same within seven days from the date of such notice; - also that parties occupying and obstructing the sidewalks for the storage of vehicles be notified to remove the same forthwith.
