- WHEREAS: It has come to the attention of this City Council that once again our Fire and Police Departments have proven their level of excellence and devotion to duty by responding to a working fire moments after knocking down a two alarm blaze; and
- WHEREAS: The department was disengaging from a two alarm fire at 30 Dover Street, when a man approached the Chief of the Fire Department stating a second fire was in a building located at 49 Dover Street; and
- WHEREAS: Chief Reagan immediately went to that address ordering apparatus to respond and in conjunction with Police Sergeant Ronald Briand and several officers under his direction and members of the Fire Department provided the rapid and successful evacuation of all residents of this building without serious injury; and
- WHEREAS: All of this activity was conducted swiftly under the most adverse circumstances by men already fatigued from fighting another fire; now therefore be it
- RESOLVED: That this City Council go on record extending our sincere appreciation and gratitude to the members of the Cambridge Fire and Police Departments for another job "well done"; and be it further
- RESOLVED: That the City Clerk be and hereby is requested to forward a suitably engrossed copy of this resolution to Fire Chief Daniel J. Reagan and to Police Chief Leo F. Davenport in order that it be read at all rolls in each department and copies placed in the appropriate personnel files of individuals involved.
