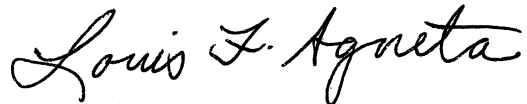

As you know the Housing Convention met this past Saturday to adopt a program that we believe can serve as a basis for meeting the most serious problem in our city, the housing problem. It is our hope in the months ahead we will see real progress made towards implementing this program. We think the City Council shares that hope and we know that you stand with us in working towards the goal of building more housing that the families and elderly of Cambridge can afford.
