In Board of Aldermen, June 10. 1863.

Ordered, Whereas a private way in Ward Two, called Clinton Street, has heretofore been devoted to the public use by the owners of the adjoining lands, and is now in a fit condition to become a public highway, and

Whereas it is adjudged by this Board that the public necessity and convenience require that said street be laid out as a public highway, and that no persons will be damaged thereby, or be entitled to any compensation from the City,

Therefore Ordered, That said private way be and hereby is laid out and established as a public highway by the name of Clinton Street, from Main Street to Harvard Street, the same to be thirty feet in width, as the fences now stand.

Ordered, That no damages be allowed to any person and whose land said street is so laid out as aforesaid.
