

To the Honorable the City Council of the City
of Cambridge:-

The undersigned respectfully represent-
that there is great need of repairs upon Western Avenue,
so called, the travelled way having originally been con-
structed entirely upon the southerly side of said Avenue,
and the earth excavated for this purpose from the
northerly side of said Avenue, where the same was raised
up and the improved, and the street being greatly narrowed
where it is laid out and the marsh. That a sidewalk
has been constructed from Pleasant Street as far as the
causeway and said marsh and in front of the land
of Horace Hews, near Pulman Street, but that there is
no sidewalk whatever across said Causeway and West-
only the way until within a short distance of Pulman Street,
nor has said excavation been filled up, westerly of
said Causeway:-

Wherefore the undersigned pray that a sidewalk may
be constructed, and said Causeway widened to the true
line of said Avenue, or such other action taken in the
premises as may be deemed proper-
