TED TWOHIG

Ted Twohig, 37

Flutist lived in Cambridge

Ted Twohig, a well-known local flutist, died yesterday morning at his home in Cambridge from an AIDS-related illness. He was 37.

Mr. Twohig's musical performances were familiar to Boston and Cambridge audiences. He premiered several new works by local composers in recent years.

He was also a member of the Boston Sinfonietta Chamber Symphony and frequently performed with other chamber music ensembles in the Boston area.

Mr. Twohig, who was born in Norwood, worked as a trust operations clerk at the Cambridge Trust Company from 1988 to 1996.

He received the Esther Boyer Griswold music scholarship along with a scholarship from the Music Guild of Boca Raton while earning a bachelor of fine arts in music performance from Florida Atlantic University.

A member of the Greater Boston Flute Association and Massachusetts Music Teacher Association, Mr. Twohig studied with Christine Nield, principal flutist of the Philharmonic Orchestra of Florida. After graduating, he studied with Carol Epple at the Longy School of Music in Cambridge.
