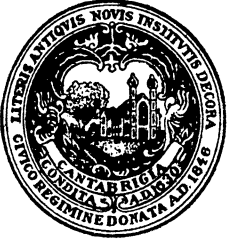

A communication has been received from His Honor, the Mayor notifying the City Council of the death of James H. Kelleher a former member, it is fitting and proper that notice be taken of this sad event.

James H. Kelleher was born in Cambridge forty-five years ago. At an early stage he showed an aptitude for politics and was a factor in the eastern end of the city. Shortly after reaching maturity he was elected to the Common Council and served for one year. After one year's service the charter of the city was changed and he retired, later to be a candidate and be elected to the General Court. He served his district as Representative with distinction and ability for five years and was then appointed to the Board of Election Commissioners where he served for four years.

He was a leader in the social life of East Cambridge several years ago, was president of the Blue Ribbon Club, active in the affairs of St. John's Literary ^{Institute} ~~Association~~ and Sacred Heart Church. His cheery presence, his unfailing good nature and his courage in the face of difficulties will long be remembered by a legion of friends who mourn his untimely passing away. It is therefore

RESOLVED:-

That the City Council hereby records the loss sustained in the death of James H. Kelleher. The innate nobility of his character endeared him to all who knew him and the City Council would officially place upon its records this tribute to his memory.
