IN BOARD OF ALDERMEN, ~~June 10, 1872.~~

By virtue and in pursuance of the authority conferred by Chapter 299 of the Statutes of the Commonwealth for the year 1872, it is hereby

Ordered, That with reference to a complete drainage of the lands named in this order, so as to abate and prevent nuisances, and to preserve the public health of the City, the several owners of lands lying within the territory in this City, bounded as follows: viz: ~~between the Somerville line on the North, Cambridge Street on the South, Webster Avenue on the West, and the Grand Junction Railroad on the East;~~ ^{Plymouth St., Hampshire St., Portland St.} the surface of which lands is below thirteen feet above mean low water, raise the grade of their said lands, filling up the same with good materials, to a grade not less than thirteen feet above mean low water, and raise the grade of all private streets, courts, and ways, upon their said lands, filling up the same with good materials, to a grade not less than sixteen feet above mean low water; and in case any such owner fails to comply with this order within six months after service thereof, as required by said Chapter 299, this Board will forthwith proceed to so raise the grade of the land and private streets, courts and ways, the grade of which is hereby ordered to be raised by such owner, and collect the expense thereof, and take such other proceedings in the premises as may be deemed expedient and proper, all as provided by said Chapter 299.

The City Engineer is ordered to furnish the proper grades to all persons affected by this order, and to raise the grade of all public streets bordering upon any of the lands, the grade of which is hereby ordered to be raised, filling up such streets with good materials, to a grade not less than sixteen feet above mean low water.

This order shall be served as required by said Chapter 299, and evidence of such service shall be preserved by the City Clerk.

All expense incurred on the part of the City under this order shall be charged to the Appropriation for Incidental Expenses.
