RESOLVED: That the City Manager, in conjunction with the appropriate City Department officials, investigate the feasibility of creating a fund for each of the thirteen neighborhoods of the City to assist unfunded community and neighborhood groups, to assist with necessary and recurring costs such as photocopying, newsletters, postage, and support for community events; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager, in conjunction with the appropriate City Department officials, determine, on the basis of population and number of community groups, the appropriate levels of funding to be allocated to each neighborhoods, but in any case not less than \$2,000 per neighborhood; and be it further

RESOLVED: That the City Manager, in conjunction with the appropriate City Department officials, devise and suggest potential criteria for distribution of these funds; and

RESOLVED: That the City Manager, in conjunction with the appropriate Department officials, prepare a report for submission to the City Council on the feasibility of this measure on or before the April 10 meeting of this City Council.
