- WHEREAS: Harvard University is currently holding an election for its Board of Overseers; and
- WHEREAS: David Scondras, now in his fourth term as a City Councillor in the City of Boston, is a candidate for the Harvard Board of Overseers; and
- WHEREAS: Scondras, an alumnus of Harvard University, has initiated projects utilizing the talent and knowledge of students and faculty at Harvard's schools to the mutual benefit of that institution and the cities surrounding it; and
- WHEREAS: Councillor Scondras has, in acknowledgement of their energy and dedication, consistently involved students in the operations of city government, resulting in a more efficient, informed city bureaucracy; and
- WHEREAS: The Councillor has served effectively as chair of the Finance, Public Health, Substance Abuse and Neighborhood Crime Prevention, Solid Waste Management, and Community Investment and Banking Committees; and
- WHEREAS: Scondras has demonstrated his commitment to minority access and representation in city government and pledges to pursue the same commitment in the role as Overseer at Harvard with regard to hiring, admissions, and curriculum design policy; and
- WHEREAS: Councillor Scondras sponsored legislation creating the Boston Human Rights Commission, a vehicle for the defense of civil rights of women, African Americans, other people of color, the physically challenged, gays and lesbians, and others who are disenfranchised; and

WHEREAS: Councillor Scondras recently visited San Jose Las Flores, the sister city of Cambridge in El Salvador, and reported on human rights violations paid for by taxes here and in Boston to his constituents and to the Congress of the United States; and

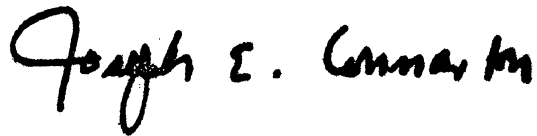
WHEREAS: All of these principles and qualities are compatible with and pursuant to the mission of the City of Cambridge, therefore, be it
