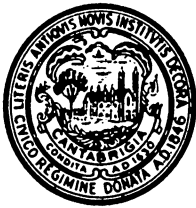

In late 1981, as Acting Chief of Police, I discontinued the use of a departmental form by which a person arrested, but not charged, signed an agreement promising to not sue the city or officer involved.
