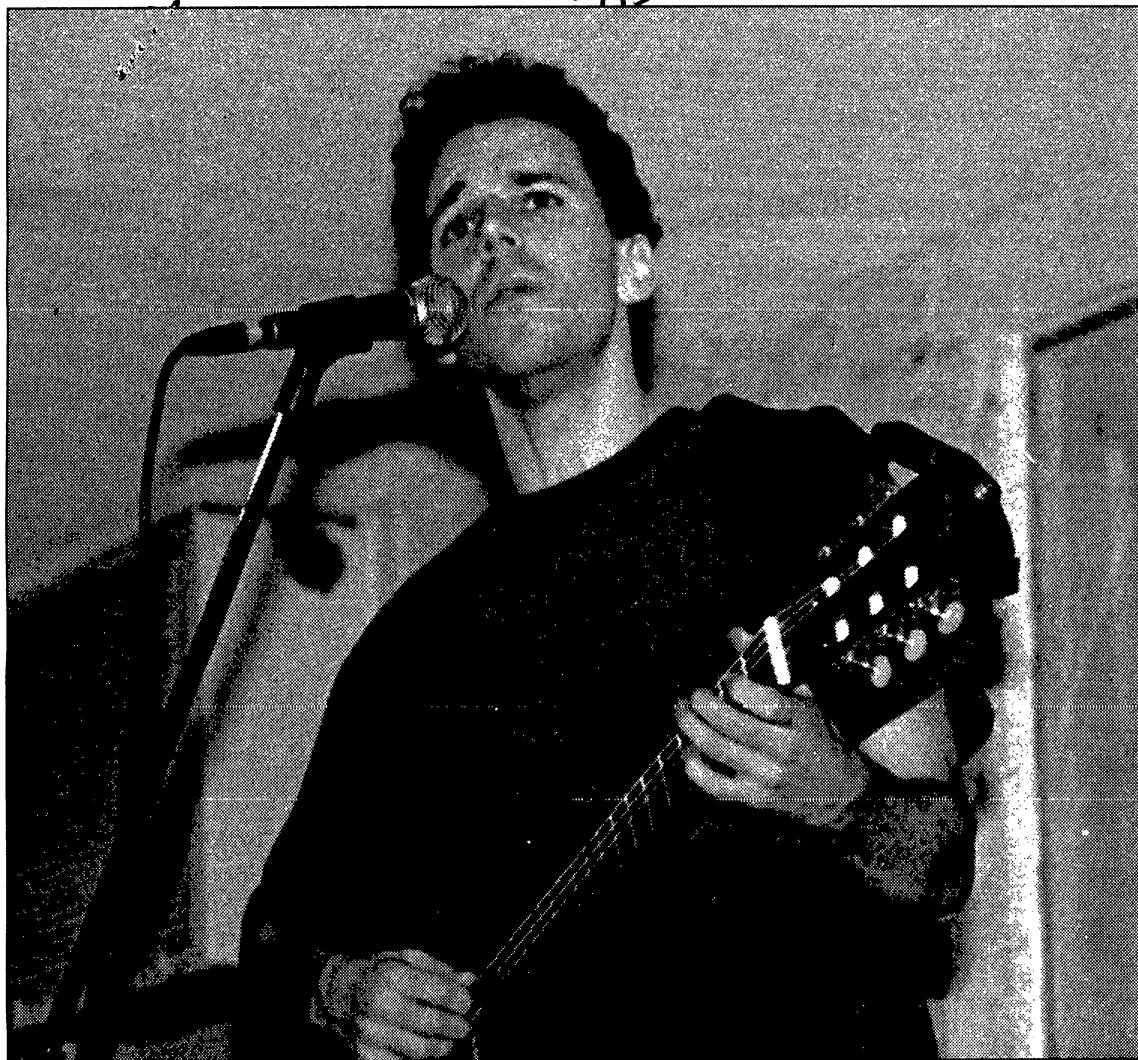

convict and of justice not to perjury. "I cannot will to my children and grandchildren the proposition that a president stands above the law and can systematically obstruct justice because both his polls and the Dow Jones index are high."

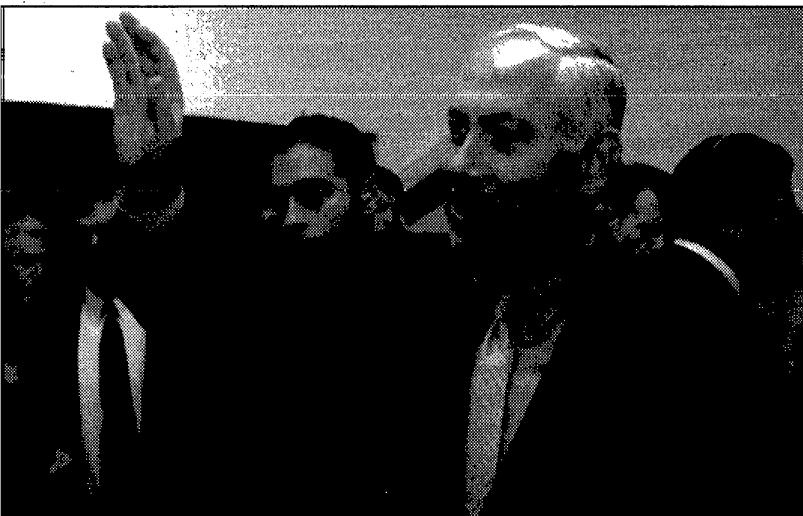
With Clinton's acquittal assured, Democrats continued their campaign for a formal vote to censure the president after the trial. But Republican opposition seemed to be stiffening, and Specter said censure would violate the constitutional doctrine of separation of powers.

"There's been very little mention of censure" in the closed-door deliberations, said Sen. Bill Frist, (R-Tenn.) "To me, the push for censure is losing steam."

Democratic leader Tom Daschle is hoping for at least a procedural vote before lawmakers adjourn for a week-long vacation, a roll call that would allow Democrats to go on record condemning the president's behavior while acquitting him at his trial.
