I reported on this matter in a memo dated May 31, a copy of which is enclosed. On August 1, I met with the MBTA at their request to review a proposal to expand the present shelters, and was informed by them on August 28 that an agreement had been reached with the Perini Corporation on design and construction details. Architectural drawings were received and approved on September 10; construction is scheduled to begin before the end of the month and should be completed before cold weather.

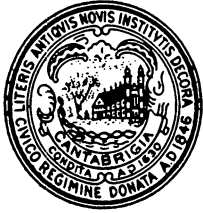
